# **“Circle of 5ths” Rummy**



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# **“Circle of 5ths” Rummy**

This is a fun “rummy” style game designed to reinforce Major key signatures and their relative minors. The game works the same as regular rummy except that each player is trying to match up the major and minor key signature cards (major key signature, minor signature and both together) to make sets of 3 or to make “runs” by putting the major or minor key signatures together in order of the Circle of Fifths. The object is to be the first to lay down all of your cards.

There are a total of 44 cards. You can choose whether you want to use two sets of cards or just one. There is also a page you can use to print the backs of the cards. I suggest laminating each page before cutting them out in order to help them last longer.

**Players: 2-4**

**Deal:** Deal 8 cards each and then place the remainder of the cards in a “stock” pile face down. The first player begins by either drawing the first card off of the “stock” pile or choosing the top card from the discard pile. Work to make sets of 3 or runs of 3 or more and place them on the table. Once no more cards can be put down, discard one card. Play then proceeds to the next player. The first player to place all of their cards in sets or runs on the table and is able to discard one final card wins! There are other variations of Rummy which can be applied to this game as well. Have fun!
